Georgia Plank is a TPP Associate specialising in governance, gender and inclusion. Her experience spans policy development, programme design, implementation, evaluation and qualitative research.

Georgia is the lead on gender and inclusion for the international component of the evaluation of the Netherlands Ministry of Foreign Affairs' Policy Framework for Strengthening Civil Society, which, at baseline (in 2022) included carrying out a case study focusing on southern leadership in global advocacy. She is also gender and inclusion lead for monitoring and evaluation support to the UK Conflict, Security and Stability Fund's MENA portfolio, with a focus on women, peace and security, including support to women participation in decisionmaking and peace processes at all levels. Other ongoing assignments include research into adolescent economic empowerment in Jordan and drivers of psychosocial wellbeing amongst adolescents in Tanzania and Vietnam. Georgia has also carried out evidence reviews on women's voice and leadership in decision-making for the Overseas Development Institute and a synthesis of project learning about what works to support women's political empowerment for CARE.

Georgia and Laure-Hélène have worked together on numerous occasions. In 2022, they collaborated on a review of the World Bank's use of analysis in fragile and politically unstable contexts, for which Georgia led on the literature and document review.

Earlier in her career, Georgia advised senior UK officials and ministers as Private Secretary to the Cabinet Office's Permanent Secretary.
